Nyembezi-Heita was appointed ArcelorMittal SA's head in March 2008 and led the firm during the lengthy and often acrimonious supply battle with Kumba. The two sides reached a new supply agreement deal last

month, replacing one suspended during the dispute and raising costs for the steel maker.

Her departure comes at a time when global steel output is picking up. But in South Africa, where economic growth is sluggish, the industrial outlook is not so rosy.—Reuters
