

WINNERS & LOSERS



WINNER

Aung San Suu Kyi

Burma's democracy champion declared a "new era" for the country after she and her colleagues won at least 40 of the 44 seats up for grabs in by-elections. Junta leaders still control most seats.



LOSER

Nonkululeko Nyembezi-Heita

ArcelorMittal SA's CEO was stung by being passed over in government's industrial programme; and the competition commission's proposed fine for collusion cut the share 6,5%.



WINNER

Li Ka-shing

Hutchison Whampoa's owner has seen profits more than double since the Hong Kong conglomerate spun off its container port business – to HK\$56bn (US\$7,2bn) in 2011 from HK\$20,2bn a year earlier.



LOSER

Sifiso Dabengwa

Trouble is mounting for MTN's CEO over Turkcell's US lawsuit alleging MTN bribed Iranian officials in 2004 to grant it and not its Turkish rival a network licence. The share has fallen 7,5% in a week.



WINNER

Alico Dangote

With contracts to build factories in eight African countries, the Nigerian industrialist and Africa's richest man is to list his \$11bn cement business on the London Stock Exchange next year to finance rapid expansion.
